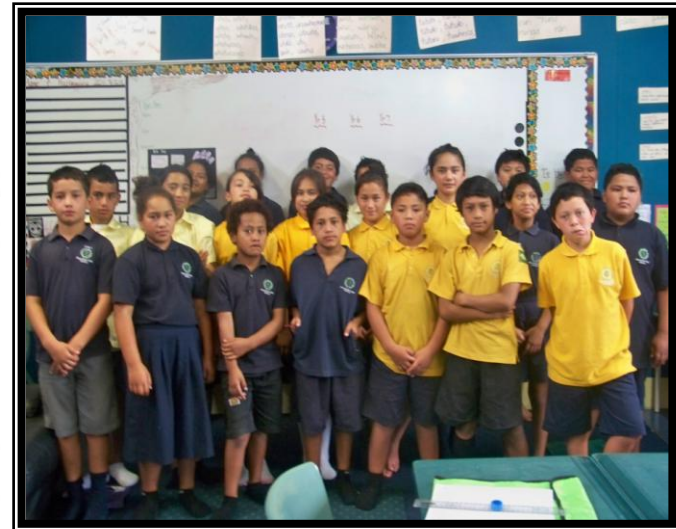

Kia ora whanau, please check our tamariki for kutu, and nits. We would like to share a home-remedy with you that maybe able to assist. Use Equal parts of vinegar and oil you have in the home. Rub into the hair, cover with a shower cap (or plastic wrap) and leave for 2 hours. Wash as normal. The vinegar loosens the nits and the oil helps slide off hair.
