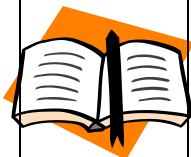
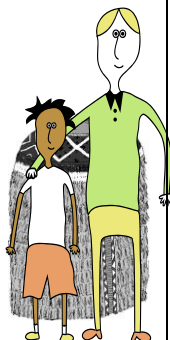
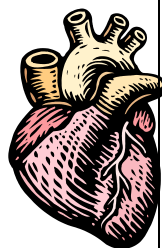
Whanau were informed of some key messages and information for our tamariki at this hui which included:

Kaupapa Ako:

Our main kaupapa is to do with our tinana, the digestive system and blood circulation. We are also learning about Marvelous Me, ko au so students are being encouraged to find out who they are, and where they come from. Please help our tamariki to become confident with their whakapapa and pepeha. Please also teach our tamariki their address and phone number incase of emergencies. Kia ora.

Student Behaviour:

Our staff are requesting that all parents speak to tamariki regarding expected and appropriate behaviour at kura, in classes, and in the playground. Pouako are constantly having to remind students of thinking before they act and about making good choices. We promote the concepts of tuakana, teina, manaakitanga, tiakitanga and aroha and would like these displayed in all areas of our teaching day. Please remind your child that if they are being bullied, they must report it to their teachers. Our staff are being approached about incidents they have no knowledge about. It needs to be brought to our teachers notice immediately if there is any bullying so we can deal with.

Mahi Kainga.

Students should be bringing home homework every week. Because our tuakana classes TH5 and TH6 have English instruction, their home work can include either or both languages. If you have any queries please contact the classroom Pouako. Mahi kainga should be done over the week and sometimes over two weeks.
