House T-Shirts on Sale



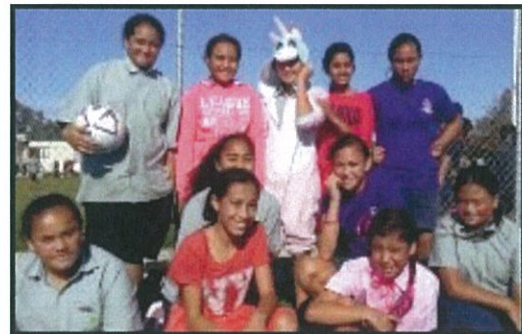

D	DANGER Check for DANGER Hazards / Risks / Safety?
R	RESPONSE Check if RESPONSIVE If not, Call 000 Ask for Ambulance
A	AIRWAY Open AIRWAY Look for signs of life Chest rise, responsive, breathing or moving
B	BREATHS Give 2 initial BREATHS if not breathing properly
C	COMPRESSIONS Give 30 chest COMPRESSIONS (2 compressions per second) Followed by 2 breaths



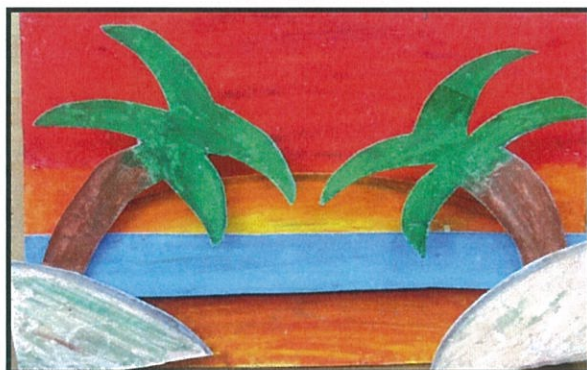
3-D ART EXPLAINED

Salu-Faith from B13 has been working on her 3D Art in preparation for the Exhibition later this term. She has been developing her planning, levelling techniques and mixing of different colours. Here is part of her working plan.

Level 1: I will be using paint to give an ombré sunset effect. I will also add a hint of **purple/pink** to look pretty.

Level 2 : I'll trace/draw the shape on white paper, colour it **yellow** with pastel, glue it on to A4 cardboard, cut it out then use scraps of cardboard to layer it.

Below is Salu-Faith's final practice which is really vibrant and bright. The colours she has chosen on each layer really contrast each other well.
