Copying which May be done on this Machine



* Copies may be made if the copying is "fair dealing" (Section 43). That is:

- done solely for a person's research or private study.
- the person doing the copying takes into account the nature and purpose of the copying
- the copying is done because the work could not be obtained within a reasonable time by purchase at ordinary price.
- the copying will not be detrimental to the potential market for , value of the work
- the copying takes into account the amount and substantiality of the part copied taken in relation to the work as a whole. It is unlikely to be fair dealing if you photocopy a whole work, a whole chapter, a summary.
- only one copy is made of the same work on any one occasion (once in 14 days is permissible).
