COVID-19 Alert Level 1 Update

- Mana Kidz Sore throat management will return to normal from the 17th June 2020.
- This means that all children who say they have a sore throat will now receive a throat swab and will no longer be sent home. No one will be sent home unless they have other signs of COVID-19 and then they will be advised to go for testing with their GP or a COVID-19 testing station (South Seas in Otara is still currently operating).
- COVID-19 suspect case definition for testing:
 - cough, temperature of over 38 °C, shortness of breath, a sore throat, sneezing and runny nose or a temporary loss of smell
 - AND**
 - has been in contact with people who have COVID-19, or has travelled overseas recently, or has been in contact with someone who has travelled overseas recently
